During the last few years Kevin has been examining the role of coachability in leadership development. At the Summit, Kevin will share research and insights for us about the coachable leader, with emphasis on how we can assess our own coachability as leaders, as well as incorporate techniques that can influence the coachability of the leaders we are helping in their journeys.

It would take a giant chunk of space in this newsletter to list all of Kevin's career accomplishments, but here are just a few of the highlights:

- 17 years in talent leadership at General Electric
- 17 years as VP and Chief Learning Officer at General Mills
- Named Chief Learning Officer of the Year by CLO Magazine
- Many publications, including his book "Dancing with the Talent Stars: 25 Moves that Matter Now"
- 8-year faculty member, Carlson School of Management, Executive MBA Applied Leadership

EVENT RECAP: MAY ROUNDTABLE FOR LEARNING LEADERS

As our country grappled with the pandemic and quickly moved to working from home in March, we considered what would be the best way to continue to provide value to our Fredrickson Learning communities. We decided that making our meetings virtual so that we can continue to share information and exchange ideas are critical goals and you, our communities, certainly responded. Since then, we've hosted three virtual community events and are planning several more as we navigate the rules of in-person engagement during this pandemic.

On May 28, more than 100 learning leaders attended our first virtual Roundtable for Learning Leaders. The topic was Leading Learning in Challenging Times, and we were thrilled to have Paul Langlois, CLO at Ecolab, share his insights and experience around how his team has responded to the pandemic.

Some of the key insights from the session included:

- 50% of attendees said COVID-19 had a "major effect," and 25% said it has had a "*transformational* effect" on their learning programs.
- The enrollments for Ecolab's digital courses had a 300 to 400 percent increase during the month of April.
- They delivered a course on Design Thinking for Learning Professionals virtually for the first time.
- They branded a lot of digital courses as part of the virtual approach including:
 - "Dr. Lisa" courses--with Lisa being a fictional doctor--to provide associates with timely pandemic information.

- A Career Start virtual session and 1-on-1 with the manager.
- They have started discussions about a redesign of in-person practice sessions.
- A key question all learning leaders should be asking themselves is this: "What new practices that we've incorporated during this time should we keep in the future?"

EVENT RECAP: APRIL LEARNING TECHNOLOGY NETWORK

On April 21, we hosted our very first virtual community event for the Learning Technology Network. Titled "Unlocking the Potential of Learning Experience Platforms," two community members--Jason Grom from Ameriprise Financial and Sivaram Jambunathan from General Mills--shared stories of implementing different learning experience platforms in their businesses. We heard about Degreed from both, and also about Axonify, Intrepid, and STRIVR.

Key insights from the presentation and audience participation through questions included:

- It's important to clarify and set expectations for why you are bringing an LXP into your learning ecosystem.
- A few key benefits for using an LXP are the ability to more easily create pathways and plans, demonstrate skill set improvements and performance growth, and incorporate AI and Data Analytics for learning programs.
- Know that you'll likely need to add these internal skill sets to your L&D team if you don't have them already: content curation, data analysis, and learning pathway programming.

We are grateful for the time and effort that both Jason and Siv gave to preparing for the event, presenting, and also answering several questions during the event. By telling us your stories, you helped us all to understand a bit more about this technology, while also learning from you and from each other.

EVENT RECAP: MAY HEALTHCARE LEARNING LEADERS FORUM

In early May, the Healthcare Learning Leaders Forum had its first virtual event - a panel on healthcare learning during a pandemic. Though this community's members are spread across the healthcare industry, some of the takeaways we heard from the panelists were the same regardless of the specific training their teams were delivering or who the learners they were delivering it to were.

There has been a sharp increase in the value perceived around agile processes, focused content, and learning and development best practices in general. Additionally, for healthcare learning leaders, it's critical to consider the personal experiences of the learners AND the team members creating learning under trying circumstances. Everyone is currently facing stresses, distractions, and unprecedented experiences and we need to keep that in mind at all times. The panel shared inspiring stories of resiliency and lightning fast adaptation, as well as key learnings that will be relied on for the foreseeable future.
